The post-graduation career outcomes report reflects information on 901 undergraduate business students who were seeking employment or continuing education. The career outcomes data presented are based on a knowledge rate of 99 percent for students who graduated between August 2018 and May 2019. "Knowledge rate" includes survey responses and information from other legitimate sources, such as faculty and LinkedIn, offering a more comprehensive view and considered a best practice of the National Association of Colleges & Employers.

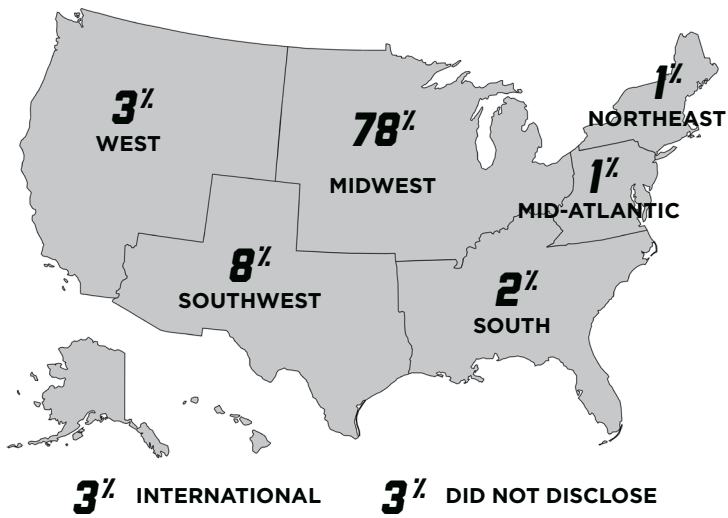

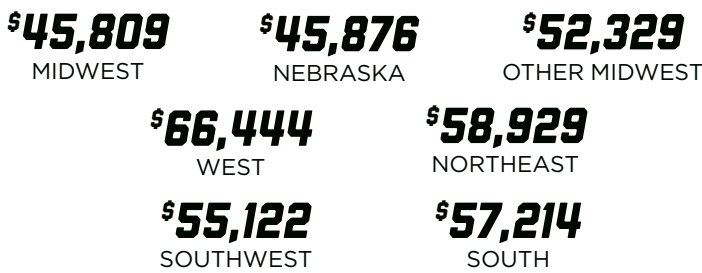

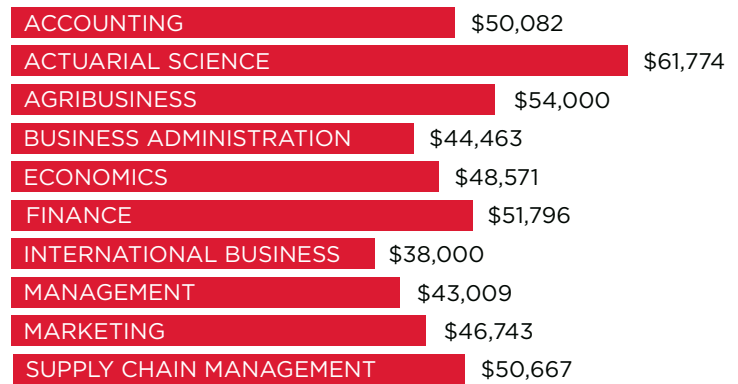
